- Budget cuts have been ongoing since 2020.
- School reconfiguration is part of the strategy to address challenges.
- Future outlook is more promising with adjustments underway.

### TRUSTEE REPORT: David Stathers

#### 1. Budget and Surplus

- Trustees are focusing on maintaining a small surplus instead of imposing further cuts.
- Cost-saving measures implemented through school closures are now contributing to balancing the budget.
- These savings are now being reinvested into student programs, which will help enhance educational opportunities.

### 2. School Closures & Reinvesting in Programs

 The funds saved from closures will now be directed toward improving student programming.

- Leasing closed schools is being explored, which could provide additional revenue for operations and allow for further reallocation of funds toward student-focused initiatives.
  - The district anticipates generating \$100,000/year from leasing these properties.
  - Any potential sale of schools would require a public consultation process.

### 3. Transportation and Survey Engagement

- The district received strong participation in its recent transportation survey, and the savings from the program will also support the budget.
- Facility upgrades are being planned, with a portion of the budget being allocated to:
  - Repaving parking lots
  - Rebranding signage
  - Upgrading playgrounds
  - Renovating sports courts
  - \$1.8 million renovation budget from the province allocated for these upgrades.

# 4. Ongoing Renovations

- Some minor renovations are still underway, including adjustments like lowering desks to accommodate student needs.
- Trustee recommends taking a tour of facilities if offered, to get a firsthand sense of changes and improvements.

# 5. Trauma and Crisis Response

- A Trauma Crisis Response Team has been established to support students and families during traumatic events, such as sudden deaths.
  - This team will help manage grief and provide critical supports.
  - Discussion on how the district can better support families during these times, including parent resources and possible DPAC (District Parent Advisory Committee) involvement.

# 2. BC Community Gaming Grants

- DPACs and PACs are eligible to apply for BC Community Gaming Grants between April 1, 2025, and June 30, 2025.
